12.20	<p>NHS England</p> <p>Better joint working at the health and social care interface is vital to improving outcomes, but our attempts so far have often failed to recognise the pivotal role patients themselves can play in integrating their own care.</p> <p>NS England is writing a vision paper for the NHS ten year plan, which describes how personalised care improves experience for people and the workforce, outcomes for people, and benefits the system.</p> <p>This session will detail NHS England's commitments for delivering personalised care for the next ten years; and will set out how it needs to work in partnership with local government to boost integrated personal commissioning to create holistic and personalised care around the needs and preferences of people who rely most on the ongoing support from health and care services.</p>
