





Risk by Ward Area (Select to Drill to Ward)




Risk Calculation


The 6 score metrics add up the number of people meeting the score criteria. Accross multiple criteria a person can appear multiple times



Total Risk Score by Ward




Average Risk Score Per Person by Ward

Management of data

- Information is received and is held for 5 years as per GDPR and Information Sharing agreements.
- Information on a child drops off front hub once 18yrs or no intelligence received for 12 months.



The above map illuminate's incident hotspots from December. West Drayton and Hayes Town were the two biggest areas of concern, as highlighted by the dark data shading above. In total intelligence received for the four Axis CCE risk categories is as follows: CSE = 8, MISPER = 36, PWITS = 20, SYV = 27



Cross Borough movement

Axis are often notified of children coming to Police attention in neighbouring areas. During December, two children open to Hillingdon Children's Services and the YJS were arrested with large qualities of Class A drugs in Ealing. Spikes Bridge Southall, where the arrests took place, is known locally to be prominent for PWITS activity. In response to this, Axis are working closely with counterparts in Ealing to better understand links between Hillingdon and Ealing children. West Area Police are aware of this issue and are attempting to disrupt activity.

Hiding in plain sight

During the last national lockdown Organised Crime Groups made adaptions to make drug dealing less conspicuous. Examples of this included using fake Deliveroo attire, supermarket uniforms and fraudulent NHS ID cards to operate publicly without suspicion. During December, Axis saw a variation of this theme with a DPD Delivery Van being linked to drug supply in Hayes. Whilst many delivery services may be legitimate, if colleagues become aware of unusual activity of this nature involving children, please let Axis know.
