Early Help Service



Salford Family Partnership is our early help offer for children, young people and families in Salford.

It requires a commitment from all partner services to work together to identify children and families in need at the earliest possible opportunity.

Place Based Working Communities

- Services come together in a neighborhood to support individuals and families. There are clear connections between universal (population level), early help and prevention, specialist services and the VCSE that provide the right support, at the right time, from the right professionals, with the person and their family at the hub.

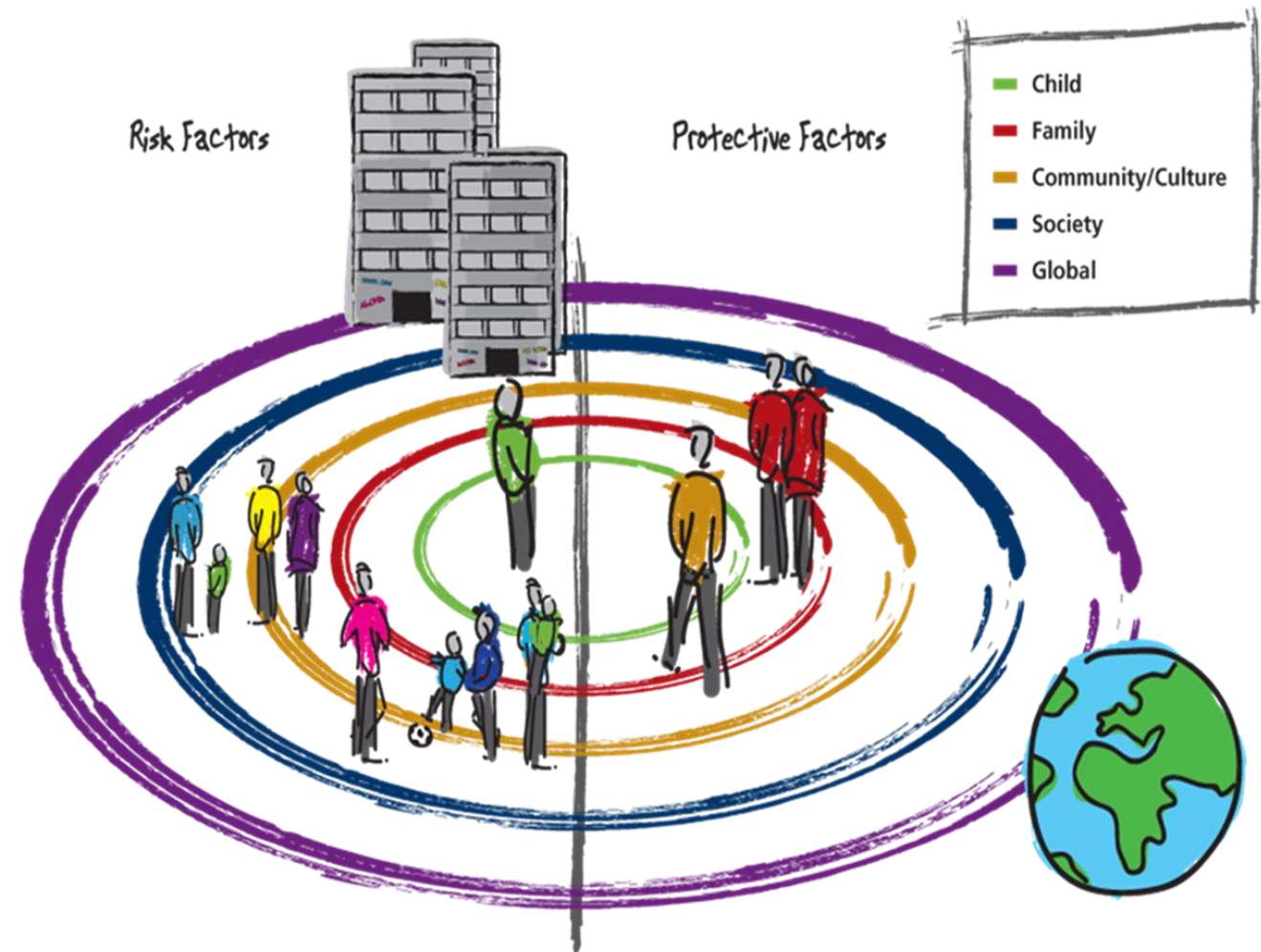


Figure 1: Ecological risk and resilience factors impacting on child development (adapted from Bronfenbrenner, 1979).

Salford Family Hub Offer

The range of services delivered through the Family Hubs includes:

- **Antenatal and Postnatal Support** – Midwifery Clinics, Healthy Child Clinics, Baby Social Groups, First Foods Session, Antenatal and Postnatal Parenting Support – Solihull Parenting Courses, Baby Incredible Years. Targeted Antenatal/Postnatal Support. Strengthening Families project. Health Promotion – Safe Sleep, ICON. Infant Feeding Support – UNICEF Gold Accredited.
- **Early Help** – Part of the multi-agency safeguarding hub - Bridge. Early Help Practitioners allocated as lead professionals. Family Partnership Model Helping Process. EHA's, TAF's. FGC.
- **Relationship Support** – Parental Conflict GM Toolkit Intervention.
- **Parenting Support** – Solihull online parenting courses, Incredible Years and Triple P for Teenagers.
- **SEND provision** - Early Support and Portage, Neurodevelopment Pathway, First Steps Group
- **Adult and Child Mental Health Support** – PPIMH Pathway, Thrive.



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
